What is geography?

Geography is the study of **places** and the relationships between **people** and their **environments**.

Geography (n.) /dʒiˈpgrəfi/

Geo = related to the **earth**Graphic = **writing**

Geographer (n.)

= An expert in geography

Geographic (adj.)

- Geographic features
- Geographic region / area / location

There are 2 main types of geography

1) **Physical geography**

This involves the study of landforms, seasons, climate, and the atmosphere.

2) Human geography

This involves the study of the network of people and cultures on the Earth.

Cartography (n.)

= the science and practice of drawing maps

Topography (n.)

= the physical appearance of natural features of land

A mountain (n.)

Mountainous (adj.)

Landforms

- peninsular (almost an island)
- island (land surrounded by sea)
- mountain range (a group of mountains)
- archipelago (a group of islands)
- coastline

Geographical regions can include areas within a country, an actual country or a continent.

Continent (n.)

= a continuous mass of land, generally recognised as a collective regions (e.g. Asia, Europe)

How many continents are there?

We use the following to accurately mark the position of places on the earth.

Equator

= a line around the centre of the earth, dividing the northern and southern hemispheres.

Latitude


= a line running around the earth, east and west, and parallel to the equator.

Longitude

= a line running from the north pole to south pole.


