

Movies (U.S.) (go to the movies/ watch movies) Films (G.B.) (watch films)

The film industry

Movie buff - I am a bit of film buff (a big fan)

Movie theatre / cinema / cinema complex

Soundtrack (engaging, enchanting, impressive, upbeat)

Plot = storyline (fast-paced, intricate, over-complicated, intriguing, full of suspense)

It has a plot with twists and turns

It has a twist at the end = unexpected ending

Protagonist (hero)

Antagonist (villain) - baddie

Subtitles (watch subtitles)

An award-winning film (e.g. Parasite from Korea)

It's a blockbuster

It's a box-office hit

On the big screen - at the cinema

A sequel - the follow up movie (e.g. Toy Story Part 2)

Types / genre of movies

Note, some words can be used as adjectives and nouns, for example, Comedy

I like **comedies** I like **comedy** films

Some words can only be used as adjectives, for example, Romantic

I like romantic films

Describing a film

TIP

It's important to be able to paraphrase (= to say something in a different way) in IELTS. Don't worry if you don't know the name of the film in English, or you can't remember the actor's name - just find a way to explain your idea.

If I remember correctly...

I don't know the name in English, but it's film about

If my memory serves me right...

I can't quite remember the actor's name but he was great...

It's on the tip of my tongue

I can't recall the actor's name, never mind, he is really famous in my country.

Do you like to watch movies?

Yes - because

I'm really into movies because

- it's a great way to kill time
- I really enjoy a good story
- they help unwind
- they help me kick back and relax

Where...

I enjoy curling up on the sofa and watching a good film I love to go our local multiplex cinema to see the latest release

With whom...

I will often watch a film with my best friend Jack.
