

Famous for
Well known for

Noted, celebrated, distinguished (e.g. writer, scientist, historian)
Notorious for (negative)

<u>Infamous</u> (well known for bad things)

## **IELTS Speaking TIP**

When it comes to talking about a famous person in the IELTS Speaking test, don't worry if you are not exactly sure of the person's name. You can get round this by saying something like eat following:

I'd like to talk about the actor who plays Mr Bean...

I'd like to talk about the singer who sang 'candle in the wind'...

I can't quite remember his name, but anyway, let me tell you about him

# **IELTS Speaking Discussion: Benefits and Drawbacks of Being Famous**

#### **Collocations**

Collocations are extremely important when speaking English. This basically means knowing which words go together. For example, the following are all collocations.

- Do business
- White wine
- · Have a drink

Below we look at some phrase and collocations to talk about **the benefits of being famous** 

- Well paid, well off, wealthy, financial freedom,
- Luxurious lifestyle, lavish lifestyle
- Get sponsorship, be a brand ambassador, get paid for advertising
- Travel the world, meet exciting people
- Get VIP treatment, get recognition, get respect, easily recognised
- Get an ego boost, having confidence, get an adrenaline rush, it builds your confidence

**Hounded** by fans (=followed too closely)

Lack of privacy

Attract stalkers / trolls (fans who follow with band intention)

Get fake friends, fair-weather friends

Constant judgment

Potential depression

Addiction to drugs/fame

Fall prey to depression

Be a victim of gossip

## **IELTS Speaking Idioms about Being Famous**
