#### Sport (n. - countable)

Which sport do you practice?

I like doing winter sports, like skiing and skating

# Sport (n. - uncountable)

I did a lot of sport when I was younger, I don't do **much sport** these days.

## To sport (v.) = to wear

She is sporting a fashionable red hat.

## Sporty (adj.) = someone who enjoys doing sport

I am not really the sporty type

There are different verbs we can use with the word 'sport' and also different sports will take different verbs.

#### Verb + Sport

Do sports
Play sports
Practice sports (more serious)

I like to play many different sports
I mainly do sports on the weekend

# Play soccer / football / tennis

We usually use 'play' for competitive team sports

# Do yoga / pilates / judo

We usually use 'do' for individual sports without a ball

I used to play football at school. I played in goals. I was really into football actually. We would also play everyday in the break betweer classes.
Which sports do you do now?
<ul> <li>I'm into</li> <li>I currently play / do</li> <li>At the moment, I am doing</li> <li>I'm fond of</li> </ul>

I'm into basketball nowadays, I currently play every Saturday. At the moment, I am playing for a local team in a local league.

#### **Grammar Rule**

When a **preposition** is followed by a **verb**, that verb needs to be in the **gerund** (the ING form).

Preposition + verb (+ING)

I'm interested IN + hikING

I am keen ON + swimmING

- It's a competitive sport
- It's a **spectator sport** (=a sport many people watch)

# **IELTS** Speaking tip: What if I hate sports?

Don't worry, if you have no interest in an IELTS speaking topic, like 'sports'.

The important thing is that you say something.

Try following this simple formula

- Say why you hate it
- Talk about past experiences of sport
- What you prefer instead

For example,

I'm not really into sports, to be honest.
I've never been really sporty.
I hated sports at school, it was so competitive,
and I used to get tired so easily.
On top of that, I'm not very strong physically, so I always struggled.
I'd much rather stay at home and watch TV.

# Idioms to talk about Sport

To **try your hand at** = to try a new activity

I'd like to try my hand at paragliding, it looks so much fun!

To take up = to start a hobby / sport

I'd take up water skiing, if I had the time and lived near a lake

**To root for** = to support (a team, a player)

I am not a big United fan, but I am rooting for United because I hate City

#### 5 different tenses

I play tennis, (present simple)

I've been playing since I was a kid (present perfect continuous)

I remember I took it up when I was 9 (simple past)

because I <u>had seen</u> my friends play it (past perfect)

And I wanted to try it too, I thought when I am older, I will be the best player in the world (1st conditional)
